




Joe's Market Garden has coffee stand on Saturdays and



• <u>Message from D9790 Conference Chairman Peter Dunn</u> Thank you for registering for the Wangaratta Conference. I just want to bring you up to date with some of issues and how you can help the Committee make it s great success. The current paid up registrations, including the rebound exchange students, are 300. The government has specific rules for venues such as ours and one week ago we could have 350 in the Theatre out of a total capacity of 510. Up to next Friday, 26th February it has been reduced to 254, but we do expect it to go back to, at least, the 350 number next week. Fortunately there is an "overflow" area of 100+ in the Memorial Hall which can be serviced by a life stream if necessary.

A modified version of Rotary in Action exhibits will be on show in Memorial Hall. This is also where the Teas and Saturday lunch will be served mainly. There are also restrictions outside of the theatre which we must comply with and these are being addressed by venue management. Before you arrive in Wangaratta you will be provided with any relevant information, especially COVID related, so as you can come fully prepared.

Whilst quite a few of you have been back into the registration booking site (try Booking) to book your optional events; we need all of you to do this promptly please. Please understand that we have to advise numbers to venues at the end of February – just a week away.

Most of these events have minimum numbers and if we don't achieve these in the next week we will have to cancel them. If you know of others who are yet to book please encourage them to do so quickly as we only have 50-60 spots available now (in line with the 350 number).

DG Bruce & Marilyn and I look forward to ensuring that you have a wonderful experience and enjoy the fabulous panel of speakers.

Candidates have until **15 May** to submit applications to their districts. Districts have until **1 July** to <u>submit</u> <u>endorsed applications</u> to The Rotary Foundation.


