### ESRAGANZOceania September 2021 Zoom Meeting report

A total of 75 joined the meeting from all over Australia and New Zealand.

The guest speaker was Karin Traeger who apart from being a runner, plogger and veterinarian, is the CEO of the **Yarra Riverkeepers Association**. <a href="https://yarrariver.org.au/contact-us/">https://yarrariver.org.au/contact-us/</a>
Andrew Kelly is the Vice-President.

She gave a compelling presentation about the impact of polystyrene upon the environment and specifically upon Melbourne's major waterway.

- Polystyrene is hard to recycle, and is predominantly sent to landfill.
   This is partly because of the poor market value in recycling this type of plastic as well as the decision of overseas countries to refuse our waste. In the environment, polystyrene breaks into micro-plastics, is ingested by animals and fish and thus finally into the human food cycle.
- A disturbing statistic she gave was that at least 800 million pieces of plastic flow the bay every year. Community audits shows that the major polluters of polystyrene waste are construction sites and shopping centres.
- After the talk we broke up into virtual Breakout Rooms to discuss how Rotary can contribute to reducing plastic waste and litter.

Many useful suggestions were proffered including -

- Plogging sessions. PV Rotary is not the only club doing this when not in lockdown.
- Rotary forming partnerships with a local river group and working together.
- Promoting recycled products. A Victorian company REPLAS are making a lot of community infrastructure such as bollards, seating, fencing etc, from recycled plastic.
- Promoting recycling Planet Ark has a great website which shows where the recycling depots are and what materials they will accept. <a href="https://recyclingnearyou.com.au/council/MelbourneVIC">https://recyclingnearyou.com.au/council/MelbourneVIC</a>
- Having a Clean Up Australia type of activity and get the community engaged. Schools are a particular place which should be targeted.
- Litter drain installation to arrest rubbish, track its origin and lobby council and businesses to manage their waste better, before it enters the local waterways.


