Rotary Club of Pascoe Vale Community Police Award 2022 (The Stephen Bull Memorial Award)



PROJECT BACKGROUND: A TREE FOR EVERY FALLEN IN GALLIPOLI

In 1934, Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the Lieutenant Colonel of the Turkish Army in Gallipoli, wrote the following tribute to the fallen ANZACS:

"Those heroes that shed their blood and lost their lives... You are now lying in the soil of a friendly country. Therefore rest in peace.

There is no difference between the Johnnies and the Mehmets to us where they lie side by side now here in this country of ours...

You, the mothers, who sent their sons from faraway countries, wipe away your tears; your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace. After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well."

From the battlefields of Gallipoli has come a friendship that has existed between Australia and Turkey which has no comparison in human history. There is no better example of this spirit than that: which existed between the eighth Prime Minister of Australia, Stanley Melbourne Bruce and the first Turkish President, Ataturk. Both men lead troops who directly fought against each other in Suvla, Gallipoli in 1915 and by remarkable coincidence both men became leaders of their respective countries in 1923. Prime Minister Bruce, who oversaw the move of Parliament from Melbourne to Canberra, was awarded the Military Cross for his acts of bravery during the Gallipoli campaign but the admiration and remarkable friendship that subsequently existed between these former enemies is mindboggling. So much so, that Stanley Melbourne Bruce only kept two photographs in his study until he died one, of his wife and the other of Atatürk.

Leading to the 100 year commemoration, we believe that the Ataturk and Bruce's friendship should inspire Australians and Australian-Turks to lead our community to further greatness. Ataturk's reference to the "soil" and "the land" in his poem to the ANZACS, is a message that the friendship between these nations and the respect for the 11,500 ANZACS and 50,000 Turks who died in Gallipoli, should be repaid by respecting and loving the land.

Our vision is for Australians and Turkish-Australians to plant a tree for every "Johnnie" and every "Mehmet" leading up to Anzac Day. We will create life from Gallipoli each year by planting trees in their name until "the land" can be proudly handed over to future generations.
