 RIMERN is on track to exceed \$150K of donations during their 1st year of operations. This volume is very close to other, similar, well-established, charitable operations.




• Environment and Sustainability Report: June 2022 Chair -Heather Harris.

- Tree Planting World Environment Day
- Sunday June 5th found the Environmental and Sustainability group of PV Rotary along- side Moreland Council and Friends of Edgars Creek lending a hand to plant trees and native grasses in the bush near the old Kodak Bridge in north Coburg. The day was wintry with a bitter wind blowing but this did not dampen the enthusiasm of the community who cam to do their bit for the environment. Thank you to Pat S who always is a faithful contributor to the E+S group. Pat and I donned gloves and got very muddy filling in the numerous freshly dug holes with new plants, then placed protective cardboard guards around them. Some hundreds of plants were interred and at the end of the session the project looked very impressive.
- Also a big thank you to Steve P and Matt W who braved the freezing winds and provided delicious hot sausages and vegeburgers for all who had worked so hard. You were much ap- preciated by all those who partook of your cooking and condiment skills and more importantly the generous donation of your time. It would have been so much more comfortable to be in a warm home!
- We printed some Rotary flyers with information about what Rotary is doing to help with the environment both in Australia and overseas, including how to find out more from us and how to join. Some were taken at the tree planting and we will use the others in the next tree planting we become involved in.
- There was also a table with everything needed to make Bee Hotels for anyone who might have been interested. They are made to house the stingless native bee and other in- sects. A great project to follow up possibly for school activity. Very simple, all made from offcuts which would normally have become landfill. There might be an opportunity for a Mens Shed to
