## • President Elect Heather:

Summary of meeting with Launch Housing On Friday July 8th Pat Solibakke and I had a meeting with George Hatvani from Launch

Housing with a view to discuss what Rotary can do to assist in alleviating homelessness in the

Moreland area.

There was much discussion around how to streamline services for this demographic and how to

ensure there was a more integrated response to their multiple and often complex needs. He

presented some sobering facts e.g. Food bank is serving 50,000 per day, and many of these are

the "working poor", who are unable to feed their families as well as pay private rental. In the

past decade or so, the government has invested \$20B in the 1st Home Buyers Grant and the

major effect it has had is to have increased house prices and made home ownership an ever

diminishing dream for many Australians. He noted if the same amount of money had been

invested in social housing, this would have provided 60,000 additional dwellings. Using census

data, Launch Housing projects there is a need for provision of social housing to 200,000 in the

next 10 years! He spoke of the need for supportive housing for specific needs clientele which

would be purpose-built with support and security on-site. For examle, there is already family

support housing in Dandenong but what is needed in general is a much higher community

awareness

of the issue of homelessness and

of ensuring this community awareness is translated into political action i.e. lobbying of political

parties. It appears that the Greens and the ALP have given more thought to this pressing

social issue and we must all approach our local members of every party and ask what they

intend to do about this dire issue.

There are many drivers of homelessness including older women, mental health issues,

disability, refugees, asylum seekers, chronic unemployment, non-citizens — the list goes on...

George heads up a project called Functional Zero - an initiative from the U.S. and mainly

financed philanthropically. It takes a more assertive approach to homelessness and aims to

"turbo-charge" homelessness reduction by actively seeking out rough sleepers, rather than

waiting for them to approach social services. In the US this has resulted in a much improved

and longer lasting welfare outcome in participants. In Moreland this requires 2 specific extra

workers who would carry out this demanding role.

Ways in which Rotary might help could be - inviting a speaker from Launch Housing (e.g.

Bronwyn James in LH fundraising, or Jenny Smith from CHP or Kate Colvin from Affordable Housing Co-op) to come and speak at a meeting or arrange a cluster meeting of Rotary Clubs

to have these speakers come to. He strongly recommended we attend other clubs' meetings

and newsletters, develop a cluster aid model perhaps, where a number of clubs collaborate

to bring about social change.

It was a great meeting and I think gives Rotary an opportunity to give meaningful assistance to

alleviate this very pressing social issue.
