- 1 Trees reduce CO2. According to coloradotree.org, an adult tree can change 48 pounds of carbon every year into enough oxygen to keep two people alive.
- 2. Trees reduce ozone levels and can mean milder temperatures and more breathable air.
- 3. Trees reduce erosion. A tree canopy can reduce the force of rain hitting the ground to a gentle sprinkle, preventing erosion.
- 4. Trees can absorb summer heat and provide a windbreak.
- 5. Trees trap dust and debris which creates generally cleaner air.
- 6. Trees provide an ecosystem for animals, birds, insects and other life, which means every tree is a potential life-saver to certain species.


