Truck Collection runs are on Wednesdays & Saturdays.

But for smaller items such as bedding & linen and small electrical items, it may be possible for collection to be arranged on other days using the volunteers' private vehicles.

Stephanie A. Urchick, of the Rotary Club of McMurray, Pennsylvania, USA, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2024-25, a decision that would make her only the second woman to hold that position. She will be declared the president-nominee on 1 October if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

With the world facing incredible challenges, including the COVID-19 pandemic, disasters driven by climate change, and conflict in many regions, Urchick says Rotary's leaders can offer a vision and a plan for overcoming these challenges.

"Measures taken by Rotary leadership to survive and end critical challenges often make our organization stronger and more resilient for future events," Urchick says. "This kind of essential leadership also creates new levels of cooperation, even among rivals, when Rotarians pull together as people of action to serve and solve a crisis."

Making regionalization a priority is crucial, says Urchick.



News from Edith Bendall Lodge

Edith Bendall Lodge is an Aged Care Facility for 60 residents with 14 Independent Living Units. It was a project of the Rotary Club of Pascoe Vale & the Lions Club of Strathmore created because of the need for aged care accommodation in the area. Many Rotarians over the years to date have served on the board of EBL. The units were opened in 1985 & the initial building for 39 residents was opened in 1991 with further extensions later.

The following is an extract of correspondence from EBL/Mayflower management to residents & families last Thursday

"Dear Residents and Families

I am writing to inform you that Edith Bendall Lodge has decided to transition its business to Mayflower, a not-for-profit community-based provider of residential aged care, home care, and retirement living options.

Please be assured that there will be no change to the day-to-day operations of Edith Bendall Lodge – residents will continue to receive high-quality care from the staff they know, in the home they are familiar with.

The aged care sector is undergoing significant reform and regulatory change, which is making it difficult for individual facilities like Edith Bendall Lodge to operate sustainably. In deciding to transition the business to another provider who will be able to continue to operate the facility into the future, Edith Bendall Lodge chose Mayflower because of its aligned values and a strong commitment to high-quality person-centred care.

We know residents and families love the warm, welcoming, homelike environment at Edith Bendall Lodge, where every resident is treated like family – and Mayflower will continue to deliver this.

Edith Bendall Lodge and Mayflower are working towards this change coming into effect from 1 October this year, subject to sign-off from the Department of Health and Aged Care. "

The building has served well for over 30 years but may need replacing in the not too distant future. As well as ensuring the ongoing care to the residents of Pascoe Vale & district, Mayflower has the resources to rebuild Edith Bendall Lodge. This will ensure that the legacy created by our club & the Lions Club of Strathmore lives on."


