This month, we saw 355 more lights distributed in the Siem Reap region of Cambodia, to Po Treay Primary School! Cambodia has one of the lowest electrification rates in Southeast Asia, with around 6 million people lacking access to electricity, and schools like this one are affected.

Cambodia Rural Student Trust (CRST) were our field partners on the ground who delivered these lights to the students. We feel particularly proud to work with this NGO, as it is run entirely by students who are from rural areas and are sponsored by CRST to attend the best high school and university in Siem Reap.

Still looking for volunteers!

Rotary Inner Melbourne Emergency Relief Network (RIMERN) has assisted 250 families to furnish their new home since its inception, with almost 7600 items delivered. What an achievement!

The value of donations is almost \$230,000 so far, another amazing figure.

However it doesn't just happen by accident. Behind these statistics is a team of volunteers who work hard in all areas to make the final furnishing of a new home a possibility. From those who go to the warehouse to sort, clean, pack and stack waiting goods, to the crew picking up donated goods and bringing them back to the warehouse, to the team who process every donation offer, then book it onto the collection spreadsheet, to the computer setup, to the Support Orders person who accompanies the recipient and their caseworker to choose their goods.


It's a lot to do and there are not enough people to cover the workload, leaving a willing few to do it all. They are becoming very weary and desperately need more hands on deck.
