

Melbourne continues to be reassuringly non-conformist with its weather. Brief glimpses of summer between clouds and rain....


Big congratulations to our BBQ team on Australia Day at Bunnings. A massive effort and grateful thanks to all who contributed on the day.

Alare has not forgotten his song of wanting to go to visit his mother. He has been singing the same song for long now. This time round, he says when he goes home, he won't come back to Umoja ever again. He says they have beautiful house which is fully furnished. (even though he's never seen his mother since abandoning him and she's never come to Umoja.) He added that when they go home, they won't be sent to complete any chore and their mother will be doing everything for them. They will be eating nice food as chips and chicken, piecer, pilau among other foods. They won't be consuming ugali as his mother is very rich. He says all this blindly but just imagine and think his home is much better than Umoja. I am sure he pursues things on his own way but when he will see the reality, he won't like it at all although I also don't know the state of his mother, but I don't see her to be having a good life. We will do our investigations before any home visit happens. Its only that the mother doesn't want responsibilities of the children, but I am sure if she has a mother's heart, she can take care of both children no matter what state she is.







The manager of Umoja and myself will look hard for his mother and see if she can cut the home sick of her son by taking custody of Alare at least some of the school holidays so that the child can be able to compare between Umoja and begin somehow to bond with her twins. Because when he keeps thinking that he was brought here, and his parents (his father is dead), are well off may make him have the thoughts of running away when he is older. So, if he gets the reality then he will have better understanding of the way things are, living the life his mother does. Let's hope we







can make reconnection in some form happen for our little Alare and Alexis.
