In 2022 – 23, Interplast organised 6 surgical visits to the Asia / Pacific area, seeing 534 patients. They conducted 1,772 health personnel training opportunities and conducted 5,712 online training sessions.

Their target for the 2022 – 2030 period is to see 20,000 patients and train 7,500 clinicians

JANUARY 2024







The reason why they were brought very early was that that was the day which all Umoja children were supposed to report. His mother was going to work and didn't want to be late thus decided to bring them that early. She left using the same motorbike they used. She didn't stay even for a minute and said that she was late for work. He had been shaved very well ready for school on Monday.

To my mind, this having been the first time Alare has been with his mother, since coming to Umoja as a baby. It will take time to bond a lot with her. It is more difficult that she works such long hours as we don't know where she works, and it is sad that she is not interested in taking care of her twins or getting back to us about future visits they might have. It is also a good thing she is working and has an ok home so who knows what the future may bring, but Alare is adamant he is only going there in the December break.

He has been promoted to grade three. This is the year in which he will be registered to do his first national exam. The good thing is that all the requirements needed to register the children are available. I have hopes that he will do well. The exam doesn't have specific dates and mostly it's a practical exam which some of the marks will be added in his grade six national exam.

Alare was bought everything in the lines of books and stationary that was needed for school with great thanks to his sponsor.

He was also bought some new school uniforms, school track pants, sox and shoes. I made sure that the uniforms which he was purchased were also big enough which would last him for a long time.















He has been doing good for the whole month since his return and was obviously in good health when he returned to us. For that we are happy and hope the bonding continues by perhaps the mother coming to visit her twins on her day off at some point. Let's hope.
