The Rotary Foundation Fund, PDG David Anderson

David is the Regional Foundation Coordinator. His region extends from Western Australia to Tahiti.

In the Rotary year 2023-4, the Foundation approved 473 District Grants and 1098 Global Grants. The minimum approval amount for a Global Grant is US\$30k.

Of the various catagories of grants, Disaster Relief Grants are the fastest growing, With US\$ 14.8m donated in 2022-3

Interestingly, individual contributions make up 75% of donations to the fund.
