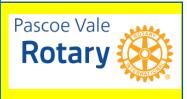
Last week, the North West Metro Police held their Neighbourhood Policing Forum. This was held at the Merri-bek Council offices and was attended by over 100 people, including 9 Rotarians from Pascoe Vale.

The forum outlined the changes to policing methods and the ways data is used to be proactive in the battle on crime. Each year, the police conduct a Community Sentiment Survey. Data from this survey helps with planning. Last year, of the over 180,000 residents in Merri-bek, there were only 233 responses.

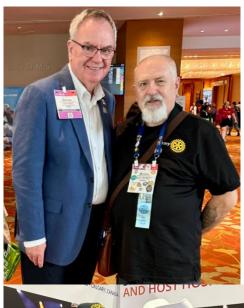




Rotary International Convention
