AUSTRAC performs a dual role as Australia's anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism financing (AML/CTF) regulator and financial intelligence unit. This dual role helps to build resilience in the financial system and enables AUSTRAC to use financial intelligence and regulation to disrupt money laundering, terrorism financing, and other serious crime.

As Australia's AML/CTF regulator, Austrac regulates more than 17,000 businesses that provide financial, gambling, bullion, remittance and digital currency exchange services. Austrac ensures that regulated businesses comply with their obligations to have systems and controls in place to manage their risks and protect them and the community from criminal abuse.
