



Italian astronaut Samantha Cristoforetti, a Rotarian, carried her Rotary club's banner to space as part of her personal items, strictly limited to 3.3 pounds. Her passion for space exploration began in her childhood, fueled by adventurous outdoor experiences and books. As a high school exchange

student in Minnesota, she attended Space Camp in Alabama, where she simulated a 24-hour mission, further igniting her dream. Upon returning to Italy, Cristoforetti pursued engineering and became one of the first female fighter pilots in the Italian Air Force. Her dedication and love for learning paved her extraordinary journey to becoming an astronaut.

1905: Rotary begins


Attorney Paul P. Harris <u>convenes the first Rotary meeting on 23</u>
