

ART MEETS AWARENESS: EGYPTIAN STUDENTS TACKLE CERVICAL CANCER

An art exhibition at the Cairo Opera House grounds showcases 36 medical illustrations by fourth-year Ain Shams University students, highlighting the fight against cervical cancer. Organized through the Rotary-led initiative United to End Cervical Cancer in Egypt, supported by a \$2 million Programs of Scale grant, the project emphasizes HPV vaccination and screenings to reduce cervical cancer cases in Greater Cairo.

Inspired by a presentation from Dr. Amal El-Sisi, a Rotary member and pediatrician, art professor Doaa El-Saati encouraged her students to create awareness through visual art. The students, previously unaware of cervical cancer, learned about its causes, symptoms, and prevention before crafting their works. In March 2024, local Rotary members, Rotaractors, and public figures attended the exhibition, which included prizes for standout pieces. The initiative aims to support Egypt's national strategy against cervical cancer and plans to continue the exhibition annually throughout the four-year campaign.
