The school has established its own Interact Club, a youth division of Rotary International, which is designed for young people aged 12-18 who want to connect with others, make a difference in their community, and expand their global awareness.

The official ceremony, attended by students, their teacher Marcella Kelly, and Wexford Rotarians Lucy Nevins and President Maree Lyng, was a "proud moment for the school" according to Marcella.

"The enthusiasm displayed by the founding members was commended by the Rotary representatives, who spoke about the importance of fostering leadership and service in young people," she added. The Presentation Interact Club has already hosted its first event, a school run for the Irish Heart Foundation, and members will collaborate in the coming weeks to decide on their next project. Lucy mentors the group and expressed admiration for the energy and focus the girls have brought to Interact.

"They are such a passionate group of young people and we are so proud of all they have achieved since holding their first meeting which was only in November." The establishment of this club, which is only the second in the county, reflects Presentation Wexford's dedication to "empowering students and nurturing a spirit of service that will benefit both the school and the wider community" she said.
