LAST WEEKS PVRC MEETING


Last week, we had the great pleasure of officially inducting Mandy Gosetti as a member of our club.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 125g butter
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 2 tbsp boiling water

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 160°C (320°F). Line a baking tray with baking paper.
- 2.In a large bowl, mix oats, flour, coconut, and brown sugar.
- 3.In a saucepan, melt butter and golden syrup together over low heat.
- 4. Dissolve bicarb soda in boiling water, then stir into the butter mixture.
- 5. Pour wet ingredients into dry and mix well.
- 6. Roll tablespoons of mixture into balls, place on tray, and flatten slightly.
- 7. Bake for 12-15 minutes, until golden. Cool on tray.

Crispy on the outside, chewy in the middle– just how ANZACs would've liked them!

Making an impact on Earth Day!

Rotary International has made environmental stewardship a central focus of its global mission. Since designating the environment as an official area of focus in 2020, Rotary and Rotaract members have been actively engaged in various initiatives to protect and preserve our planet.

Key Initiatives and Projects


- Freshwater Protection and Restoration: Rotary has partnered with the United Nations
 Environment Programme on the "Community Action for Fresh Water" initiative, empowering members to restore and sustain local freshwater ecosystems.
- Sustainable Land Use: In Milwaukee, Wisconsin, the Rotary Club transformed industrial land along the Milwaukee River into an arboretum by planting prairie grasses, enhancing local biodiversity and green space.
- Nature-Based Climate Solutions: In Taiwan, Rotary members have utilized global grants to create and improve habitats for species like little terns, purple crow butterflies, and tree frogs, while also educating the public on biodiversity conservation.

Global Engagement

- Finland: A collaboration among 114 Rotary and Rotaract clubs has provided freshwater testing kits to schools, contributing data to a national water resources inventory. Additionally, clubs are monitoring blue-green algae and addressing marine litter to protect local freshwater areas and the Baltic Sea.
- Egypt: Rotary members are renovating fishing boats to collect plastic and organic waste from the Nile River. They are also supporting women in upcycling this waste into marketable products, promoting both environmental cleanup and economic empowerment.
- EndPlasticSoup Initiative: Originating in Amsterdam, this project has expanded to over a thousand clubs worldwide, focusing on collecting and recycling plastics and raising awareness about plastic waste.

Support and Collaboration

Rotary's environmental efforts are supported by various groups, including the Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group, the Rotary Action Group for Endangered Species, and the Food Plant Solutions Rotary Action Group. These organizations assist members in planning effective environmental service projects and building awareness of environmental issues.
